## Person-Centered Case Management

It is important for people to know that Person-Centered Case Management has been implemented and evaluated across multiple populations, including co-occurring disorders, substance abuse and addictions and TANF populations.

Under current evaluation is a project in North Carolina with the prison system (BRIDGING case management) with individuals suffering with HIV/AIDS and who are being released to the community, and also individuals who are homeless in Kansas City and Boston.

The results have emphasized the importance of relationships and continuity of care, the importance of Personal Wellness/Recovery Planning and short-term goal attainment in areas of social outcome and the critical role for advocacy around successful normal interdependence, social responsibility and reciprocity.

## Workshop Overview and Objectives

- What is the overarching purpose of our work? How will we measure and quantify “success”?
- Revisiting the key concepts of motivation, problem and change
- The seven Core helping functions of Strengths-Based, Person-Centered Work and how these may serve as a framework for integrating case management, counseling, probation/parole, social services, mental health and school systems.
- Practical applications of the six principles of strengths perspective
- Strengths approach and consistency with Motivational Interviewing, (Harm Reduction approaches, Solutions Focused/Brief Therapies), crisis intervention, recovery models and cognitive/behavioral strategies

## Workshop Overview and Objectives (continued)

- Increasing skills in developing Person-Centered Strengths Assessments
- Increasing skills in generating individualized, collaborative treatment/service plans with service participants
- Increasing skills in strategic advocacy efforts
- Increasing skills in using interdisciplinary team/group format to become more effective and efficient in our work
- Setting the agenda for the follow-up day of training and measures of fidelity with the model as a result of the training

## Who will be Qualified to Provide PCCM Services for Billing?

- 1) Have at least a BA or BS degree from an accredited college or university in social work, counseling, psychology or closely related field; or be equivalently qualified by work experience or a combination of work experience in the human services field and education, with one year of experience substituting for one year of education.
- 2) Possess demonstrated interpersonal skills and ability to react effectively in a wide variety of human service situations.
- 3) Meet the specifications of having completed the required Addiction and Prevention Services training curriculum for PCCM by an APPS approved trainer.
- 4) Individuals completing the training curriculum for PCCM may be required to attend additional training by AAPS on an annual basis.

Dr. Walter Kisthardt is nationally and internationally recognized as a dynamic, informative, inspirational, and entertaining speaker, trainer, and educator. He has been a major contributor to the development, evaluation, and dissemination of Strengths-

Based, Person-Centered Community Care. He has provided consultation within a wide range of settings, both in-patient and outpatient, in 42 states, in England and New Zealand. Participants have consistently reported feeling affirmed, challenged, renewed, and rekindled in their passion and personal commitment to assisting others. Dr. Kisthardt models creativity and innovation by incorporating original music from his CD, “On Your Case” and poetry from his book “You Validate My Visions: Poetic Reflections on Helping, Healing, Caring, and Loving” to illustrate points in a manner that speaks to the very soul of the helping enterprise. Dr. Kisthardt has conducted seminars for administrators and providers in Hospice, Developmental Services, Mental Health, Head Start, TANF, Homelessness, Substance Abuse, Corrections, Education, Children and Family Programs and Vocational Rehabilitation.

Dr. Kisthardt is the Chair/Director and Associate Professor at the newly accredited BSW Program at Park University. He holds a BA in Sociology and Social Work from Elizabethtown College, Pa.; an MSW is from the University of Hawaii and a Ph.D. in Social Work from the University of Kansas. Dr. Kisthardt also has a wide range of direct practice experience, including both in-patient and outpatient therapy and supervision of case management.

Dr. Kisthardt has provided training and technical assistance with addictions providers in Kansas, Oklahoma, Missouri, Maryland, Delaware, and Florida. He has been on the faculty for the Mid-America Addiction Technology Transfer Center for over five years.
